About Forming a Team

What is Walk Across Kalamazoo?

Walk Across Kalamazoo is designed to raise funds for The Children's Hospital at Bronson, southwest Michigan's only children's hospital. Funds raised allow us to continue to offer the highest quality of pediatric care right here in Kalamazoo. That means patients and their families don't have to leave our community to receive the care they need.

How do I register?

Register online at bronsonhealth.com/walk.

What does it cost to participate?

Adults age 18+ (includes t-shirt): \$25

Children age 6-17 (includes t-shirt): \$15

Children younger than age 6 are free.

Additional shirts are \$5 each. All shirts can be picked up the day of the walk.

How long is the route?

The long route is 5K and the short route is 2.5K.

What does a team captain do?

- Recruit team members: family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, business associates, people from your school or place of worship
- Serve as the liaison between the team and Bronson
- Encourage team members to set and meet individual and team goals
- Add up team pledges on the Team Pledge Tally Sheet available at bronsonhealth.com/walk
- Encourage team members to have fun

How does my team gather pledges?

Make sure each team member is registered. Go to bronsonhealth.com/walk to print out as many pledge sheets as you need. Your team captain should collect all team members' pledge sheets and money and use the Team Pledge Tally Sheet to add up the team's donations. Then the captain turns everything in to Bronson on walk day.

What if it rains?

Walk Across Kalamazoo will take place rain or shine. If weather becomes dangerous, local media will be notified that the walk is cancelled.

Are pets, bicycles, strollers, wagons and skates allowed?

Strollers and wagons are allowed. Bicycles, scooters and in-line skates are not allowed. Pets are allowed if they are on a leash. Please be sure to stay on the sidewalk at all times and obey all traffic signals.
